William Walker, charged with having forged a bill of exchange for £20 with intent to default **Geo. Foster Day**, at Liverpool.

Mary Turley, charged with the wilful murder of her infant child, **James Turley**, at Liverpool.

John Greenwood, charged with killing **Samuel Fletcher**, at Farlsworth.

George Stainfield, charged with having assisted in the wilful murder of **John Bragon**, of Liverpool.

William Flinn and **Robert Shedock**, charged with having assaulted and robbed **William Ashcroft**, on the King's Highway, at Walton on the Hill.

William Illingsworth and **Ann** his wife, charged with having broken and entered the dwelling-house of **Frederick Hugh Hampton Dutton**, of Colne.

Alice Marsh, charged with having stolen four £1 Bank notes, the property of **William Spencer**, of Wigan.

George Clarkson, charged with having stolen 20 pounds weight of linen yarn, in the bleaching grounds of **Thomas Birch**, of Wigan.

John Kemp charged with having wilfully stabbed **John Evans** of Liverpool, with intent to murder him.

Robert Gregson, charged with having robbed **John Heatley** at Westham.

James Elnger, **John Forrest** and **Richard Forrest**, charged with having stolen 44 pieces of printed calico in the bleaching grounds of **Ralph Clayton** etc. at Cuerden.

Wright Whitehead, charged with killing and slaying **Maria Whitehead**, at Rochdale.

Edward Morgan, **Mary Harling**, **Elizabeth Harrop** and **Sarah Roberts**, charged with having stolen 35 Bank of England notes, value £40 the property of **George Ward**, of Liverpool.

George Moore, charged with having stolen the bag of letters, sent from the Postmaster at Altrincham, to the Postmaster at Manchester, and with having robbed the said bag of a certain letter, containing 2 bills of exchange, for £100 each.

Elizabeth Sharples, charged with having stolen a bill of exchange, value £22 9s. the property of **Wm. Shelmerdine**, of Manchester.

Richard Sharples, charged with having forged an endorsement on a bill of exchange, value £22 9s. and with having uttered the said bill of exchange to **Richard Constantine**, of Bolton.

John Heap, charged with having stolen 3 pieces of cambric, in the bleaching grounds of **William Grant** etc. situate in the township of Tottington-lower-end.

William Tyson, charged with having stolen a watch, the property of **Wm. Simpson**, of Ulverston.

William Mason, charged with having uttered to **Elizabeth Crook**, at Chorley, a counterfeit sixpence, and with having in his possession 40 counterfeit shillings, and 160 counterfeit sixpences.

James Lord and **William Cunliffe**, charged with having broken and entered the dwelling-house of **Adam Eiton**, of Tottington lower-end, and with having stolen upwards of 20 guineas etc.

Nicholas Whittaker, charged with having stolen a gold seal and other articles, the property of **William St. Clare**, executor of the late **Thomas Whitaker**, of Simonstone, deceased.

James Topping, charged with killing and slaying **Alice Broxen**, at Orrell.

John Gregson, charged with having stolen at Walton le-Dale, 20 Bank of England one pound notes, and six

pounds and ten shillings in silver, the property of **Henry Sudell**.

William Westhead, charged with having enbezzled the sum of £4 10s. which money he received for **Sir Archibald McDonald**, Knight; **Edward Venables Vernon**, Lord Archbishop of York; and **Robert Haldane Bradshaw**, when in their employ, in the capacity of a clerk.

James Ridgway and **John Wardell**, charged with having put on board the ship *Hercules*, on the point of sailing from Liverpool to America, divers implements used in the manufactories of this kingdom.

Samuel Stott, charged with having forged a bill of exchange, for the sum of £13 with intent to defraud **Jeremiah Jackson**, of Droylsden.

David Wooding and **Dennis Mannion**, committed for want of surities for their appearance at the next Assizes, they having embarked, with intent to leave this kingdom, on board the ship *Union*, bound from Liverpool to New York, in the United States of America, for the purpose of exercising their trades as spinners.

LANCASTER ASSIZES.

On Saturday evening, the **Hon. Sir Simon Le Blanc** arrived here, from York, and opened the commission at the Castle. The next morning, he attended divine worship at St. Mary's church, accompanied by **Samuel Chetham Hilton**, Esq. the High Sheriff, and a great number of other gentlemen. An excellent discourse was delivered, from iv. chap. Hebr. 13v. by the **Rev. John Clowes**. A collection was made for the Relief of the British Prisoners in France, which, we are happy to add, amounted to £62. The **Hon. Baron Thompson** did not arrive here till late on Sunday evening, and the next day the Grand Jury being sworn, he delivered his Charge to them. Their names are as follows:

We have given the substance of the trial which took place on the first day; and intend to give those of any importance in our succeeding papers.

The following prisoners were committed to our Castle for trial, in addition to those mentioned in our last paper:- **Margaret Frost**, charged with the murder of a new-born female child, at Bolton; **John Johnstone**, for obtaining money under false pretences, at Liverpool; **P. Smith**, for having a forged note in his possession; **Patrick McCourt**, for uttering forged notes; **Andrew Hamilton**, for stealing 12 silver table spoons, and other articles, the property of **T. Crowder**, of Liverpool; and **H.E. & M. Perry**, for assaulting an excise officer.

On Monday, **Edward Morgan**, **Mary Harling**, **Eliz Harrop**, and **Sarah Roberts**, were all found guilty of stealing £40 in Bank notes, the property of **G. Ward**, of Liverpool.

On Tuesday, **John Greenwood** was acquitted of killing **S. Fletcher**. **Eliz.** and **Richard Sharples** were also acquitted of stealing a bill of £22 9s. at Manchester. The latter was found guilty of forging an indorsement upon the same bill. **S. Stott** was acquitted of forgery.
