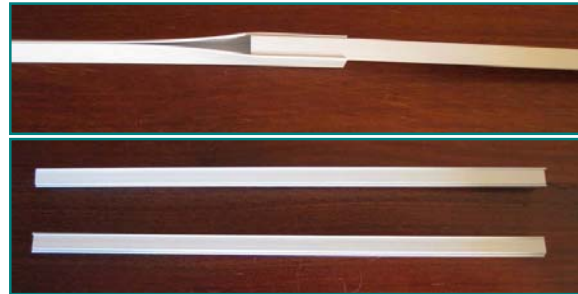
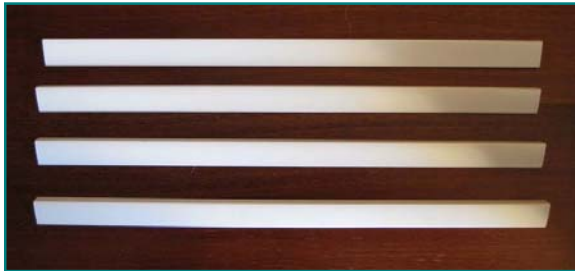


Knitting bag

*A bag to use up odd balls of DK yarn
I used 3 strands – one was a mohair type
which gave the finished bag a ‘felted’ look.*



*For handles I used 4 slide binders (which are
used to hold loose papers) I put one inside
another to make them strong.*



Needles: 6mm circular needle & 2 straight 6mm needles

Using circular needle cast on 80 stitches using 3 strands of yarn – continue to knit in a circle – marking the beginning of the round.

Knit until you reach the desired length ending at your marker.



Continue by changing to the straight needles and knit 15 – cast off 10 – K15. Turn and work on the last 15 stitches:

- K1 purl to last stitch K1
- Knit row

Continue like this for 2 inches (or more if required) put stitches on a holder and rejoin the yarn to the first 15 stitches and work to match the above.

Then:

- K15 – cast on 10 – K15
- K1 purl to last stitch K1
- Continue in K2 P2 rib until the rib part fits round the slide binders
- Cast off in rib

Rejoin the yarns to the remaining 40 stitches and complete the other side in the same way.

Stitch the rib part over the slide binders and decorate with flowers.



Knit some flowers:

Using single yarn and 3.25 needles

Cast on 36 stitches

K1 cast off 4 stitches to end 12 stitches remaining

Thread yarn through remaining stitches and pull tight – then tidy it up to look like a flower.
